

## **Tecumseh Heritage Committee Recognized with Provincial Award**

OHS B. Napier Simpson Jr. Award presented June 11, 2016 Ontario Legislative Assembly, Toronto, Ontario

In 1967, The Ontario Historical Society (OHS) established an awards program to recognize individuals, organizations, corporations, and authors who have contributed significantly to the preservation and promotion of Ontario's heritage.

The B. Napier Simpson Jr. Award of Merit recognizes a municipal heritage committee in Ontario for special contributions to heritage conservation in its municipality in the recent past. The recipient of the 2015 B. Napier Simpson Jr. Award is the Town of Tecumseh Heritage Committee.

In partnership with the Lakeshore Black Heritage Committee, the Town of Tecumseh Heritage Committee worked towards the municipal heritage designation and provincial recognition of the Historic Banwell Road Black Community Settlement Cemetery. This cemetery, also known as the Smith Cemetery, honours the African Canadian pioneers and Freedom Fighters who settled in the area.

The Town of Tecumseh Heritage Committee contributed to this important heritage work by researching the burial site (previously listed as abandoned), locating the owners and organizing the clean-up and maintenance of the site, and searching archives for descendants of the burials, ensuring access to the site (and its protection), organizing the plaque unveiling ceremony, and making financial payment of the required fee.

The OHS is pleased to present the Napier Simpson Award to the Town of Tecumseh Heritage Committee.

The award was presented at the Annual General of the Ontario Historical Society at the Ontario Legislative Assembly in Toronto, Ontario.
