## **Great Examples, Forms, and Templates**

- The Huronia Museum's <u>Education Department Blog</u> has a great (yet simple) <u>overview of their school tours</u> and programs, with all-important curricular links for teachers.
- The <u>Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre</u> has an incredibly detailed section of their website
  dedicated to <u>school programs</u>, with a different section for each grade level (K to 8), including
  program expectations!

   <u>Site</u> clear, concise, and visually appealing in a single page! A great model for writing your own brochure.
- The <u>MacLachlan Woodworking Museum</u> has a very clear <u>booking policy</u>, <u>booking form</u>, and photo release form for school programs, making it easy for educators to plan ahead.
- Take a look at school program booking forms from the <u>Peterborough Museum & Archives</u>, the <u>Pump House STEAM Museum</u>, <u>Casa Loma</u>, and the <u>Gardiner Museum</u>.
- <u>Logic Model Worksheet</u> from <u>Shaping Outcomes</u>, a tool to help you analyze your resources and strengths, and plan your future outcomes for a particular program, initiative or activity.
