


2019 OHS Fred Landon Award Recognizes *Untold: Northeastern Ontario's Military Past*, volumes 1 and 2.

The Ontario Historical Society proudly presents the 2019 Fred Landon Award, which recognizes the best book on local or regional history in Ontario, to Dieter K. Buse and Graeme S. Mount, for their book *Untold: Northeastern Ontario's Military Past*, volumes 1 and 2, published by Latitude 46 Publishing.



Untold: Northeastern Ontario's Military Past, in two volumes, brings to print for the first time stories of Ontario's "Northeasteners" as seen through the lives of men and women who served in the Canadian military, principally in the two world wars. This part of Ontario is vast and holds far-flung districts—Algoma, Cochrane, Manitoulin, Nipissing, Sudbury, Temiskaming—extending from the bottom of James Bay south to Mattawa on the Ottawa River—from Manitoulin Island at the top of Lake Huron in the west as far north as Hearst.

The authors, Dieter K. Buse and Graeme S. Mount, retired professors of history at Laurentian University in Sudbury, have a passion for local history writ large. They recognize that less attention has been given to this region by military historians because its volunteers and conscripts (while they more than not enrolled locally) more than not served in units that are associated outside of the region, in populated centres of southern Ontario, or elsewhere. Their research work is as broad as the region and offers a thoughtful framework to understand it.

At the same time, their research is intended to be a catalyst to interested researchers who want to pursue the histories of individuals from the Northeast who appear in this book. In sum, *Untold* sheds new light on aspects of Canada's military and people's history by incorporating stories of the peoples of the Northeast.
