



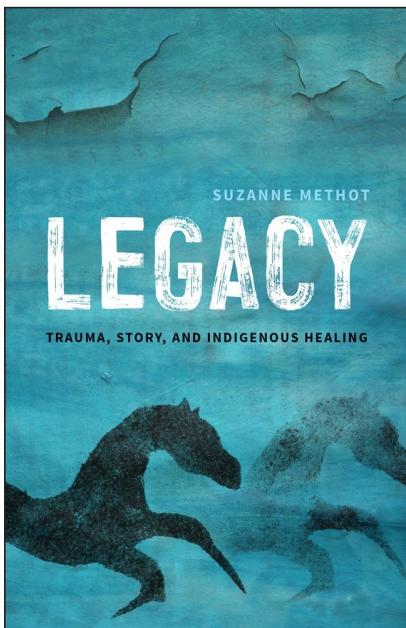
OHS Huguenot Award Recognizes Suzanne Methot for *Legacy: Trauma, Story, and Indigenous Healing*

The Huguenot Society of Canada Award honours the best book—or substantial article—published in Ontario within the last three years that has brought public awareness to the principles of freedom of conscience and freedom of thought. The 2019-20 recipient is Suzanne Methot for her book *Legacy: Trauma, Story, and Indigenous Healing*, published by ECW Press.

Legacy is a tremendously humane and thoughtful examination of what five hundred years of colonization have done to the indigenous peoples of the Americas. Through the use of history, traditional narratives, and personal stories, Suzanne Methot weaves a relentless portrait of Indigenous cultural dislocation and community breakdown. *Legacy* is passionate and provocative, but not without hope that in the current search for reconciliation Indigenous traditions and ways of knowing will help to lead to a new era of healing, justice, and equality.
